Williamstown

Melbourne's original seaport, Williamstown has developed into a fashionable maritime village with many historical buildings, cafés, restaurants and a vibrant area that locals and visitors love. Williamstown's northern and eastern coastline is dotted with piers, gardens and remnants of the area's maritime history.

Hobsons Bay Coastal Trail

This 23 km cycling and walking trail links many of the natural and cultural features of Hobsons Bay. Most of the trail is through coastal parkland.

Along the trail you'll find a series of markers, designed like channel markers, which provide direction and information.

Public art

As you move along the coastal trail, stop to enjoy the public art along the way. Many of these works have been created by some of Australia's leading artists.

43 Stony Creek backwash (start of trail)

At the northern end of the trail, the estuary of Stony Creek includes an extensive boardwalk, mangrove revegetation and a memorial park to the workers who lost their lives in the West Gate Bridge disaster.

Timeball Tower (5.5 km from start)

Built in 1849 using local bluestone, the tower originally operated as a lighthouse. From 1861 to 1926, the Timeball Tower allowed passing ships to accurately set their chronometers.

Williamstown Botanic Gardens (7.6 km)

Officially opened in 1860 and listed on the Register of the National Estate, the gardens provide a green and tranquil respite.

100 Steps to Federation (19.8 km)

Take in the view of Port Phillip Bay and Cheetham Wetlands – a migratory bird habitat – from the top of the grand basalt staircase and enjoy the picnic facilities in Truganina Park.

Altona Pier (16.9 km)

Adjacent to Logan Reserve, and with a series of bronze sculptures of marine creatures in its forecourt, the pier is a great place to set out for a walk and is an easy-to-identify point for meeting up with friends.

Jawbone Reserve (9.5 km) and Altona Coastal Park (13.1 km)

The trail provides access to important salt marshmangrove habitat. Altona Coastal Park includes the remnants of the former Williamstown racecourse.

Skeleton Creek (22.9 km)

At the western-most point of the trail, the lagoon on Skeleton Creek is a great place to see swans and pelicans.
